I grew up in Norfolk, Nebraska. A town in the northeast corner of the Cornhusker state. 60 miles directly south of Yankton, South Dakota and just about the same distance southwest from Sioux City, Iowa. When I was a child my mother enrolled me in Catechism classes at St. Mary's

Catholic Church. A parish right in the center of Norfolk.

It was during that time I was introduced to the scriptures with some depth and substance. I can remember that one of the Psalms that I felt was one of my favorites during those class sessions was Psalm 150. It is a Psalm that I still find meaning and foundation for my own life journey.

But as I read through that Psalm now, of course it means something different to me these days. Back then I was just being introduced and was just starting to learn about God and God's presence. I have some miles behind me now and many more life experiences. Yet, in this chapter of my life, the Psalm invites thankfulness for God's presence in all sorts of contexts and experiences. As I look back over my life, even in those moments when God seemed absent or irrelevant, I understand now that God's spirit was not void. It was steady. It was committed. It was inspiring. It was sustaining.

Psalm 150 reads this way... from Eugene Peterson's interpretation, *The Message*.

"Hallelujah! Praise God in his holy house of worship, praise him under the open skies; Praise him for his acts of power, praise him for his magnificent greatness; Praise with a blast on the trumpet, praise by strumming soft strings; Praise him with castanets and dance, praise him with banjo and flute; Praise him with cymbals and a big bass drum, praise him with fiddles and mandolin.

Let every living, breathing creature praise God! Hallelujah!"

Sit back and take this chapter all in. It is as if the writer wants us to be in praise of God for everything we have every minute of our lives. And the writer is correct. Everything we have from the very breaths we take and every beat of our hearts is a gift from God and we should celebrate.

I'm not saying that we need to go out and buy God a cake or a Dairy Queen blizzard of the month, but what I am saying is that we should be throwing God a party ... and we do, something that we try to do each Sunday when we come to worship.

So do me a favor, take time right now, today, to give God thanks for every gift you have been given and start keeping track. Write it down somewhere so you can experience how present God really is in our lives. It's O.K. to celebrate God today, tomorrow, and always.

<u>Confirmation Meeting - September 7th @ 9:00 a.m.</u>

One of the great joys and privileges of ministry is the opportunity to accompany young people on their spiritual journey. We do this in many ways here at Zion Church, but one of the most important is through the Christian rite known as "Confirmation." In our tradition, we believe a person is joined to the universal church – the Body of Christ – through the Sacrament of Baptism. When an infant or very young child is baptized, the baptismal promises are made by one or more parents and/or sponsors (Godparents). As the child approaches adolescence, the local church offers that person the opportunity to publicly affirm their baptism. That affirmation of baptism is called Confirmation.

This year's Confirmation Classes will be led by Pastor Jeff as well as Carol Embrey and Donna Hartig.

If you were in 7th grade confirmation classes last year, we welcome you for your 8th grade year. If you are currently a 7th grader or know of someone in 7th grade that might be interested in confirmation, please let us know by contacting Pastor Jeff or by calling the church office. 
FALL SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES BEGINNING - SEPTEMBER 7th @ 9:00 A.M.


2026 Family of Faith Retreat Interest Survey
